


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


Hold it lightly, as illustrated, and it falls naturally into the right shaving position, blade edge just touching the skin. Then draw it across the face, not hoe fashion, but with the Angle Stroke shown, and the keen GILLETTE blade will cut smoothly in any direction-with the grain, across it, or against it. 
