READY TO COMBAT DIPHTHERIA HERE

N. B. Health Department Urges
Toxoid Use—Fear Disease
to be Prevalent

Diphtheria will be of a serious type and more than usually prevalent this winter, according to a statement last night by Dr. H. L. Abramson, provincial pathologist. The Department of Health will be prepared to give immunizing toxoid freely.

Several cases of croupous diphtheria have made their appearance in Moncton but there is no immediate fear of an epidemic developing. Dr. Abramson said that the Board of Health has made arrangements for the distribution of toxoid to all parts of the province of any amount of the toxoid they may require. The toxoid, which he said will give complete immunity, is a development of former toxoids and has been in use for the last four years. Dr. Abramson said that diphtheria had been marked for eradication by science and it was hoped that this would be accomplished with the help of the toxoid.

HELP THE GOOD CAUSES.
To the Editor of The Times-Star:
Sir,—It has appeared to me that if you would be good enough to publish the enclosed letter which we have received in connection with our Christmas appeal that it may help to influence some other kind friends to subscribe to our funds.

I may say that up to date the collections in the pots on the streets are seriously low, in fact they are only 50 per cent. of the amount subscribed in the corresponding period in past years.

We find the greater need for relief during the months of January, February and March, but of course have to make use of the opportunity afforded at the Christmas season to replenish our funds, and thus prepare for the heavy call upon us during that period.

We purpose distributing about 125 Christmas baskets to needy families who will not be otherwise cared for. The baskets will contain on an average:

- 5-lb. roast of beef.
- ½ lb. of tea.
- 10 lbs. turnip.
- 2 lbs. Christmas pudding.
- ½ lb. nuts.
- 2 lbs. sugar.
- 1 lb. of butter.

½ peck of potatoes.
2 lbs. beans.
½ peck apples.
2 lbs. candy.
2 loaves of bread.

It will, therefore, be clear to you that in order to do this we must ask for the usual generous support of our kind friends in the city of Saint John.

If you would be good enough to publish the enclosed letter and make mention of any part of my communication that you think may be helpful we would be greatly obliged to you.
