NIGHT TARIFF.

From the 1st of May to the 31st of October inclusive, from 10 o'clock p.m. to 12 o'clock p.m., the charge for cabs shall be one-half more than the above tariff, and after midnight to six o'clock a.m., double the above tariff; and from the 1st November to the 30th of April inclusive, from 9 o'clock p.m. to 12 p.m., and after midnight to six o'clock, the same additional charges.

CHILDREN.

No fare shall be charged for children under eight years in charge of an adult. Children over eight years and under twelve years, charged half price. Over that age full fare.

BAGGAGE.

One trunk, and articles that may be placed inside cab, are to be carried free. For every other article placed on the outside of the cab, the cabman is entitled to five cents.
