BOSTON, Mass., June 18.—All heat records for a June 18th were broken generally throughout New England today, and before the sun's rays were tempered with a brisk wind that sprang up towards evening four deaths and many prostrations had occurred. The dead are:

Thermometers on the streets registered 100 and over, but no cases of prostration were treated at the hospitals. H., had a mark of 94, while up in the green hills of Vermont, Morrisville was uncomfortable in its hottest June day, 100 in the shade being

Boston was the greatest sufferer sofar as prostrations are concerned, there being at least 12 reported to the hospital authorities during the day. The thermometer starting in the morning in the sixtles, climbed gradually until, during the afternoon, in those places affected by the heat, it had soared well into the nineties.

The humidity today was fortunately not so high as on the two previous days, when summer weather was practically inaugurated for the first time, but the sudden change from the previous weeks of unseasonable cold caused great discomfort.

One of the hottest places reported in New England was the inland town of Bridgton, Maine, which, cut off from a cooling sea breeze, sweltered at 105. Newport, R. I., was one of the most comfortable places on the New England weather map, a bright, warm June sun being tempered by a fresh northwest wind which kept the mercury at 68 at the highest point reached during the day.

Even the usually cool spots in Maine succumbed today to the sun's rays and southwest winds. Portland had the hottest June day since June 23, 1888,
