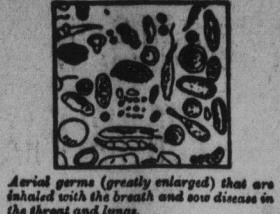

# WANT IMMEDIATE REPATRIATION OF DEPORTED POLES AND LITHUANIANS AND LIBERATION OF ALL BOHEMIANS, CZECHS AND OTHERS ARRESTED BY CENTRAL POWERS.

London, Jan. 14.—Immediate repatriation of deported Poles and Lithuanians and the liberation of all Bohemians and Czechs and others arrested by the Central Powers for their connection with pacifist propaganda, were among the demands made by the Russian delegates at the Brest-Litovsk conference on Friday, according to the Petrograd correspondent of the Exchange Telegraph Company.

"The return of refugees to Poland and Lithuania is of the utmost importance in the question of self-determination," declared Foreign Minister Trotsky.

## DOMESTIC QUESTION.

To this the German delegates replied: "These demands involve questions of internal policy which cannot possibly be discussed in the peace parleys."

Foreign Minister Trotsky, however, declared that the Russians will not abandon their demands.

Petrograd despatches received here today report that interest in the Russian capital now has been diverted from the Brest-Litovsk peace negotiations to preparations for the meeting of the constituent assembly, the Bolshevik authorities anticipating trouble have brought four warships from the ice from Kronstadt to "maintain order."

Anti Bolsheviks believe Premier Lenin plans to discard the constituent assembly entirely and to displace it with the workmen's and soldiers' congress which meets January 21.

Today is the Russian New Year and the next two days will be observed as a holiday. No newspaper will be published.
