Peasants Sell Animals for Three Boxes of Matches or CUNARD ANCHOR

Stockholm, Mav 16.—Russian peasants of Moscow gladly sell & horse for three boxes of matches or a kilo of salt, it is declared by persons said to be in touch with conditions in the interior of the country.

Observers cite this state of affairs as the cause of the counter revolution in March, which, they say, began to take definite form in January. Unweldiness of the Soviet administrative machine, the differences among the Bolshevist leaders and the fuel crise, with consequent stoppage of transportation and lack of food, are given as the reasons for the subversive movement.
