

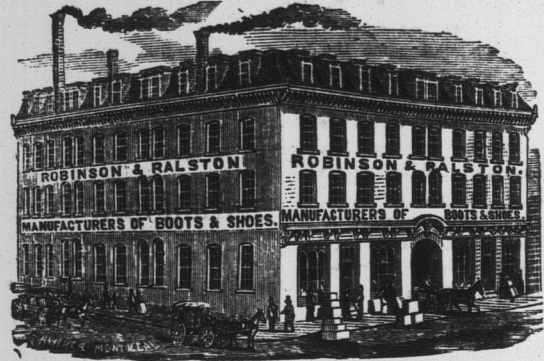

LAST NIGHT'S CARNIVAL!

A SPLENDID SUCCESS.

The Skaters and their Costumes—Youth and Beauty on the Coast of Ice.

The Second Masquerade of the season took place at the Victoria Skating Rink last night. The crowd of spectators was not as large as at the preceding one, but the genuine success of the affair, which depends more on the number and taste of skaters than of spectators, was successful and gratifying, inasmuch as it exceeded in variety, judicious arrangement and novelty any previous masquerade. There must have been over three hundred representatives from all nations and climes of the earth; and when the moving scene, supplemented and aided in its attractiveness by brilliant music, presented in kaleidoscopic view Kings in all their gorgeous trappings, Grand Dukes, Knights in Coats of Mail, Officers in resplendent uniforms, Court Jesters, Clowns and Pantaloones, grave College Bachelors, moving slowly along with a Dandy in his blue coat and brass buttons,—Firemen, Lumbermen and Sailors, Members of Parliament, Governors, Patrons, Police-men and Indians, Red Riding Hoods, French, Roman and Highland Peasants, Sisters of Charity, Flower Girls, Gipsies, Sunlight, Starlight and Daylight,—the effect can be imagined as one of UNUSUAL BRILLIANCE.

The number of dances was not so large as usual, but they produced more effect through their musical instruments. The Court dresses looked well, particularly the Duke of Orleans, Cardinal Richelieu and the Knight of St. Elmo. Mr. City Fly Chang was there without his harem of 1800 struts. The Paris Crew were represented, but they did not come into contact with the disreputable looking
