BILL.

An Act to enable the Trustees of the Ottawa District Grammar School to sell the present Schoolhouse, and apply the funds arising from the Sale thereof towards purchasing a new site, and erecting a new School-house in the Town of L'Orignal.

MHEREAS by authority of the Provincial Statute Preamble. of Upper Canada, passed in the eighth year of the Reign of King George the Fourth, and intituled, "An Act U. C.. 8 "Act to authorize the Reverend John McLaurin to convey cited." 5" to the Ottawa District School Trustees a lct of land for "the purposes therein mentioned," the late Rev. John McLaurin, late of the Township of Longueuil, in the District of Ottawa, conveyed to the Trustees of the Ottawa District Grammar School, and their Successors in office, 10 a certain stone building situate in the said Township of Longueuil, and built expressly for a District Schoolhouse, with one acre of land thereunto attached, for the use of the said District School for ever; And whereas the said School-house is in a dilapidated state, and from its 15 distance from the Town of Longueuil, is not adapted to the use for which it was intended, and it is expedient to sell the same, and appropriate the funds arising from the sale thereof towards purchasing a site and erecting a new building for the purpose, in the Town of L'Orignal:

And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, Trustees em-That it shall and may be lawful for Charles Platt Tread-the Schoolwell, Charles Hersey, James Penrose Wells, Thomas Hig-house. ginson, Neil Stewart, James Stirling, John Kearns, 25 James McCaul and William Edwards, Esquires, Trustees of the said Ottawa District Grammar School, or a majority of them, to sell the said School-house and the land attached thereto, and the said Trustees or a majority of them are hereby empowered and authorized by Deed 30 of Conveyance under their hands and seals to grant, bargain, sell and convey in fee simple, the aforesaid Schoolhouse, with the land thereunto attached, unto such person or persons as may be disposed to purchase the same.

20 Be it therefore enacted, &c.:

And be it enacted, That the Trustees aforesaid or Another site 35 a majority of them shall and may, and they are hereby chased with empowered and required to vest the money accruing the proceeds, from the sale of the said School-house in the purchase of such other site in the said Town of L'Orignal as they
