I suggest special delivery as, if possible, I shall leave here tomorrow night about eight o'clock for Boston. On the other hand, it is possible that it may be necessary for me to stay on for several days.

If Mr. Rockefeller does not hear from me, he will know that I am still in Baltimore, and Mr. Wheelwright has generously insisted on my staying with him at his house; so that if you are wanting to connect with me by phone, it would be best to communicate with me either through Mr. Wheelwright's
