no one could write it as we I as you, even though someone else signs it (and I would be happy to see you sign it), pointing out the sham of the whole Pilgrin show. At the very time he was there, his Radio Commission, without doubt on his instructions, were denying to the Conservative Party the slightest broadcasting of the coming Convention, and making certain that the Conservative Leader at least would not be allowed over the radio. All this by the High Priest of equality: The radio has been monopolized by King and made his private reserve for years, and he intends to continue that monopoly. The only meaning "liberty" has for him is liberty to do what he likes. In its universal sense there is no greater enemy of liberty than Mr. Mackensie King.
