Ottawa Nov. 3rd, 1910.

Sir,-

With reference to your letter of the 5th July 1909 No. 879809 and letters from this Department of the 7th Jan'y. and 22nd August last regarding a proposed addition to Keheewin Indian Reserve No. 123 to be used as Hay land, I shall feel obliged if you will inform this Department if this addition has been granted.

I may say that when the Reserve was re-adjusted in 1904 the Indians claim that they were not aware that this portion would be cut off.

As the Hay lands in Townships 61 and 62, Range 4 and 5, West of the 4th Meridian which were held temporarily for these Indians for a number of years, have recently been taken from them, they are very much in need of these lands. Your file 32350 T.G.I.

The lands required are immediately North of the Reserve between it and Sinking Lake with a strip of Marsh about one half mile wide along the Lake.

The following are the sections, North part 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, Fractional 31, 32, 33, 34, 35, all in Township 59, Range 6, West of the 4th Meridian, except the Island Section 33 and the Fract. N.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of 35. A copy of the Township plan is enclosed.
