ELMCREST AYRSHIRES.

THE attention of our readers is called to the sale of Sandiland Brothers, of Williamstown, Ont., who are advertising with us now. A few weeks ago our representative called at Elmcrest and was very favorably impressed with the stock. This herd was founded thirty years ago by the late John Sandiland, the foundation stock coming principally from the noted Glenhurst herd, which at that time every effort has been put forth to maintain a high standard of excellence. The most noticeable features of the herd are large size, good dairy type, large teats and persistence of the sire. The herd now consists of 89 head. A number of the older cows are grand-daughters of the famous Silver King. The younger cows are mostly sired by Leonesmuck Crown Prince (Imp.), and Stonehouse Snow King, the former being an excellent sire with lots of style and quality, the latter also being of excellent breeding, sired by the champion bull, Harbottle King cow (Imp.), a beautiful cow and a great producer.

The herd is now headed by Glenhurst Torra Master, who is recognized as one of the best herd dairy bulls in Canada, and is proving himself quite up to expectations. His sire, Leonesmuck Comet was a sire of the highest quality of the bull appeared in our issue of August 20th of last year. He is considered one of the best of his kind in the West. His dam, Leonesmuck Torra Master cow, was a very fine cow of splendid type and a great producer.

The Sandilands Brothers are now offering a few young bulls of the best of which is a yearling bull of good pedigree and service age. Who is our representative called there were about twenty calves of both sexes running together in a large yard and it is question just where else, as uniformly this bunch would make equally as good. As a whole the Elmcrest herd appears to have a solidarity about it that should appeal to the average buyer of Ayrshires.

A SCOTTISH AYRSHIRE PERFORMANCE.

EDITOR, Farm and Dairy.—The following, taken from a recent issue of the Scottish Farmer, Glasgow, needs no explanation or adduces what may be done in record work. I am more than convinced that we have thousands of Ayrshire cows in Canada that if entered in the Record of Performance and given due care would make equally as good records as "Ayrshire Well Wisher" in Scotland. There is a lot of common sense in this article, and especially his reference to making a lot of ordinary cows with a high-class sire, the trust most of our Ayrshire breeders will make use of the Record of Performance as a great value to every pure-bred breeder.—W. Ayrshire Milk Records.

Sir,—Like "Amateur" I am a reader of your valuable paper and am interested in anything relating to the Ayrshire. On reading his note in your paper of 26th April, I felt inclined to see if I could not produce something even better, just for the sake of the Ayrshire breed, so I got my milk record books out and selected three of what I thought might come near, with the result that I find I have a cow, which for the last three years has an average of 1,125 gallons and makes a fair start this year again for another 1,200 gallons. The other two which I spoiled her in three quarters. The other two have hardly as good an average, but both of them in one year have in five years produced five calves, and gave respectively 607 gallons and 800 gallons of milk. I fall a bit short of having an average of over 1,000 gallons for the whole herd, which is to be expected, and for which I give "Amateur" much credit and praise. My herd of between 70 and 80 cows I had 18 with an average of 1,144 gallons, and other nine with an average of 887 gallons and the others touching off and on 700.

It is satisfying for anyone who believes in milk recording to study closely the milk record returns for the last six or seven years and to notice the increasing number of cows with over 1,000 gallons every year in their heads, whilst on the other hand to some it will be a little disappointing to see that the same has never will unless they siter their views, and think of some of the other parties' stock than their own. It takes both a good sire and a good dam before you can get a good offspring, and owned where a lot of us get disheartened at the job, by buying a big bull through well bred sire and mating him with a lot of useless milking cows, expecting to have his size and quality of his own.

A large number of men still maintain that the same holds good with the difference of milk records, and I admit it has a little, but if they have not the right kind of cow, they will never know where their farm is, they will find themselves unable to compare with the others, and I know from experience as I have
