A Bill to continue, for a limited time, the levying of the Duties imposed by the Provincial Act of the forty-fifth year of His Majesty George the Third, Chapter Thirteenth, and for applying a certain sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned, was, according to order, read a second time.

Mr. Papineau, moved, seconded by Mr. François Caron;

That the faid Bill be now committed to a Committee of the whole House.

Mr. Coffin moved, in amendment, seconded by Mr. Bell;

To strike out the word "now," and insert "on Monday next."

The House divided on the question of amendment, and the names being called for, they were taken down, as follows:

Messers. Blanchet, Gauvreau, Dénéchau, Borgia, Bowen, Coffin, Mure, and Bell.

Nays.

Messieurs Papineau, junior, Langlois, Bruneau, Bellet, Féréol Roi, Jean Baptiste Bedard, Blouin, François Caron, Larue, Huot, Durocher, and Viger.

So it passed in the negative.

Mr. Blanchet moved, in amendment to the main question, seconded by Mr. Cossin;

To leave out all the words after "that," and infert "the House do "now resolve itself into a Committee of the whole House, on the first "order of the day."
