WEIR OWNERS ASSOCIATION OF CHARLOTTE AND ST. JOHN COUNTIES

St. Stephen, May 11.—Prominent weirs owners of Charlotte county met here this afternoon, and effected an organization for the protection of their interests against threatened injustices at the hands of the sardine packers of Eastport and Lubec, as contained in a recent notification to the weirs men that the packers will not assume any responsibility for payment for any fish delivered to their boats, or their factories, if such fish shall afterwards be condemned by the inspectors of the association, or by the United States government, or State of Maine inspectors.
