CHICAGO, June 25.—Statements that contrary to first reports the burnt district of South Dakota had not been touched by rain except in a few spots rained the wheat market today from a sharp attack. The close was firm at prices varying from 78c to 1-1/4c under last night to 1-8c above. The outcome in corn was a shade down to 1-40 up and for oats an advance of 1-8c to 7-8c. Provisions finished weak by 5c to 10c.

The Liverpool market closed 3/4d to 1/2d lower on wheat, 1/2d to 1/4d lower on corn. Paris wheat closed 40 to 45 higher.
