WATER COMMISSION WILL RENT FARM

Meeting of the Commissioners Was Held on Friday Afternoon—Important Business Transacted

At the regular meeting of the Water Commissioners held yesterday afternoon in the city hall, there were present: Chairman, John Fair, A. G. Montgomery, Mayor J. H. Spence and Secretary, Fred Frank. The secretary was instructed to advertise the Berry Farm for rent and was also instructed to have the fences on the farm repaired. The commission also granted Yardley Bros., a five year lease on the land west of the dyke at an annual rental of \$80 to be paid half yearly in advance.

Communications were read from J. H. Birckett, Kingston, regarding steel pipe; Chipman and Power regarding extensions; Boiler Inspection and Insurance Co., reporting the condition of the boilers. The Y. C. A. directors asked for a reduction in the water rate all of which were filed. A list of accounts were passed.
