INTEMPERANCE IN EATING IS FATAL

More Deaths Caused In This Way Than By Drink
NATIONAL PROBLEM
Of Primary Importance Is Care of Public Health

Ottawa Journal-Press: "The care of the public health is a national problem of primary importance. It is a reflection upon any community to have deaths from typhoid fever and other diseases which can be prevented by proper steps to have any deaths from tuberculosis."
"More people die in Ontario every year as a result of intemperate eating than of intemperate drinking."
"The first duty of a statesman is the care of public health."
When, in the course of an address before the members of the People's Forum in the Regent Theatre, Dr. C. J. Hastings, Public Health Officer of Toronto, made the foregoing plea for a national campaign to prevent disease, he drew applause which indicated that his subject was one of great interest to those present, and that the majority of the audience shared his views.

CORRESPONDENTS USED WILY TRICK

Alex. Stewart Accused of Disparaging Canadian Soldiers
SUSPEND SENTENCE
And Accused is Allowed To Go Free

Guelph, Ont., April 12.—Alexander Stewart, the Minto township farmer self-convicted on the serious charge of sedition, appeared before Chief Justice Sir Glenholme Falconbridge this morning for sentence and was allowed to go on suspended sentence. The charge against him, which was a lengthy one, including the calling of his majesty's soldiers bums and loafers, stated that a load of rags, which was being weighed at the Harrison weigh scales would likely be made into cloth for the good of the men at that and also that he could get along without any help from England and was quite able to fight his own battles, and that he would not allow a son of his to fight for the empire. When asked if he had anything to say why sentence should not be passed on him, he replied that he was sorry that he had made the statements.
T. Monroe Grier, crown prosecutor, drew attention to the enormous amount of harm which could be done by such remarks as Stewart had made. He complimented the complainant in the case, John Rowland of Walkerton, for having laid the charge. Counsel for the accused, Mr. Nicol Jeffrey, in pleading for leniency, pointed out that his client had contributed to patriotic funds. His lordship dealt with the enormity of the offense, but thought the ends of justice would be met by allowing accused to go on suspended sentence, he to pay a reasonable proportion of the cost of the case.

CANADIAN NORTHERN

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS
The sole land of a family, or any member thereof, over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta, a claimant must appear in person at the District Land Office or Sub-Agency of the district. Entry must be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (not sub-Agency), on certain conditions.
Duties—Six months residence upon a quarter-section of the land in each of the years. A homesteader may live within five miles of the land, or a farm at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation on certain conditions.
In certain cases a homesteader, good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre.
Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after starting homestead, also 50 acres extra cultivation pre-emption notice, and a homestead soon as homesteaded text on certain conditions.
A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre.
Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 20 acres and erect a house worth \$500.
