"The best work," said the Market street manufacturer, "is the toth-brush. We don't make them and they are not made in America, because it don't pay. In France girls draw them at 7 cents for L(00 holes, and 6,000 or 7,000 draws is a good day's work. I pay 25 cents per 1,000 draws for horse brushes, and have had girls earn 59 a week. Girls are peculiar, though. I had one girl lately who had no trouble in earning %0 a week, but all of a sudden she dropped to \$2. When I asked her what the trouble was she turned up her nose and said "she dida't have to work any more, she was going to get married."" In making tooth-rushes the bristles are wired the same as in a horse brush, except the wire is yery fine and the holes are not bored through. They go nearly through, leaving a thin shell at the back.
