THE PORK MARKET. - Many farmers in this section always take particular care to have their hogs properly killed and dressed for the market. There are some however, who through carelessness offer their hogs for sale in a condition that is not pleasing to pork packers, and is par-ticularly annoying to farmers when they find that a deduction in weight is made on account of their carelessness. The following rules of the Pork Packing Association will be read with interest and we hope with profit:—lst. That on all members and friends. dressed hogs with bung gut left in, 4 lbs: be deducted. 2nd. That on all shoulder stuck hogs, 5 to 10 lbs. be deducted according to amount of damage, 3rd. That on dressed hogs not opened at breast, and gullet left in, 4 lbs be deducted. 5th. That boars be unmerchantable. 5. That on stags, if accepted by buyer, one-half shall be deduced. 6. That on aged or flabby sows one-third be deducted. 7th. That on mutilated hams an allowance of 5 to 10 lbs, be allowed according to amount of damage. nams an allowance of o to 10 lbs, be allowed according to amount of damage.

Sth. In killing hogs care should be taken to have the carcase dressed at once, otherwise the lard is no use for anything but grease, as it is tainted and the lard turns a green color. A considerable de-duction in weight is made when hogs are not dressed as soon as they are killed.—


