SIXTY-ONE BILLS ARE PASSED

The second Provincial election campaign in the Province of Alberta will be a short one. This afternoon His Honor the Lieutenant Governor dissolved the Legislature. Writs have been issued for the election to take place on Monday, March 22nd, with nomination a week earlier, on Monday, March,15th.

Liberal conventions will immediately be held in the different constituencies to select candidates. The convention for Edmonton takes place tonight, as does also that of Calgary.

The Liberals in all parts of the province are entering into the campaign with the greatest enthusiasm. The policy of the Government has met with the endorsation of Liberals and Conservatives alike. Probably no government has ever appealed to the electors with a better record than that of the Rutherford administration during the past three and a half vears.

The re-election of the Premier without opposition in Strathcona constituency, has been practically decided upon and in a number of other constituencies the Liberal candidates will also likely be returned unopposed.

In almost every one of the thirty-nine constituencies the Conservatives feel that the opposition is a hopeless one and their candidates are only being put in the field in an endeavor to hold the provincial party together with a hope of victory in the future.

It is practically certain that with one exception all the members of the late Legislature will again ie in the field for re-election. Dr. John McLeod, of Poneka, is the only one of the late House who has announced his intention not to again be a candidate.
