# The Tragic Side of Trade Troubles.

Consternation has been caused in he North by the great lock-out of oilermakers and others, ollowing small strikes on the Tyne and Clyde. As the result, some 38,-000 men have been idle on the Clyde, Tyne, Mersey, Humber and elsewhere within the Federation area.

The shipbuilders of Belfast, London, and the South Coast are not in he Federation.

To appreciate the appalling nature of the situation one has only to go back to 1908, when the same area was affected by a terrible shipyard war that lasted seven months.

On that occasion, the trouble startd by the engineers refusing to accept a reduction of 5 per cent on their vages and when this dispute had ontinued for some weeks, the emuated of their own accord, and the loyers, seeing no hope of a speedy ttlement, took the drastic measure of proclaiming a general lock-out, affecting about 80,000 men.

### Starvation or Charity?

able scenes of distress were witnessed in the affected districts. The direct wages loss on the North-East Coast alone was about £45,000 weeky, and many of the work-folks preerred starvation to charity, even

where charity was forthcoming. In the Newcastle suburbs many of the workers had to part with every stick they possessed in order to buy bread. 
