

Much Peat in Ireland.

Ireland possesses 25,000,000 acres of peat bog—one-seventh the total area of the island. Much of this peat is concentrated in the centre of the country, in the Bog of Allen, but there are also large tracts in other localities. To utilize this peat, not merely for domestic use, but also for power purposes, is a problem which has exercised the minds of prominent Irishmen for many years, and the Department of Scientific and Industrial Research has now appointed a committee with Sir John Griffiths of Dublin as chairman, to investigate the

Your Boys and Girls.

Few mothers realize how much sleep a baby will take if given the opportunity and not only babies, but small boys and girls. A baby, until he is nine months old, should sleep from two to two and a half hours after his morning bath and for an hour in the afternoon. Then he should sleep from eleven to twelve hours at night. He should not be sung to or taken up for any reason except sickness. As he grows older one nap is sufficient and that is best taken after lunch. Up until school age all children should be trained to take this afternoon nap. From four until nine years of age children should go to bed from seven to seven thirty in winter and from eight to eight thirty in summer.
