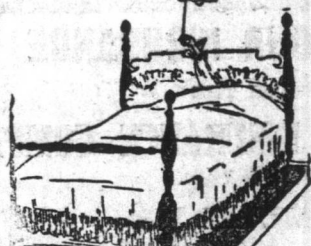

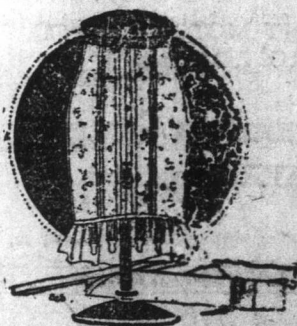

The Drama at St. Joseph's.

On Monday, June 7th and Tuesday, June 8th, St. Joseph's Dramatic Club will present in the Parish Hall an entirely new form of entertainment. The first section of the programme will contain several numbers by our leading vocalists. Interspersed will be many children's songs and dances with limelight and pantomimic effects. Miss Frances Ryan introduced this new form of chorus amongst us, and those who, on St. Patrick's Day, heard and saw "The Holy City" after her method, were loud in their praises. The present concert will be on similar lines, and as Miss Ryan has taken infinite pains with her pupils, the most exacting patrons will be pleased. The second half of the bill is a Newfoundland comedy, every line of which is original, and written especially for St. Joseph's Parish. Of course all the personages and incidents portrayed are purely imaginary; there is no vulgarity, no personality, but unalloyed fun throughout. The central figure of the piece is Theodore Kieley, K.C., M.H.A. Euphonic, generous, hot-tempered, serenely self-complacent, Kieley is firmly and sympathetically sketched, and as personated by Mr. Thomas Rolfe, he will stand out in full and bold relief. Kieley's right hand man is Mattie Dunn, who excels in exhibiting the comic side of a situation. This part will be admirably taken by Mr. Frank Walsh. The presence of Mrs. Dunn, personated by Miss Frances Ryan, lends a pleasing tone of domesticity to the first scene. In fulfilling the dearest wish of Mrs. Dunn's heart, Kieley evidences his broad-minded manhood. Other parts are taken by Mr. Ray Jardine, Mr. Fred Shortall, and several other gentlemen; while the comic songs and choruses will be sustained by a suitable orchestra.

Practically all the plays presented in our theatres portray life and scenes foreign to us. Frequently, therefore, they arouse in us only a simulated and bored interest. Those who are curious to see the special traits of Newfoundland dramatized without vulgarity and without offense, should not fail to be present in St. Joseph's Hall on June 7th and 8th.
