

THE DEATH OF TOM HOOD.—Tom Hood, the editor of *Punch*, died in London, Eng., on Friday. Mr. Hood was about forty five years of age, and was the only son of Tom Hood the poet, and a humorist from whom he inherited considerable literary ability. He had been editor of *Punch*, a comic periodical, and the most important rival of *Punch*, for a number of years, and was the author of a number of successful farces and some numerous poems, one of which, "The Test of Friendship," is a favorite with public readers. Mr. Hood has also written several bright novels.




