ALL PROVINCES TO JOIN 6000 ROADS CONGRESS

An Expenditure of More Than \$60,000 Involved in Present Programs.

[Special to The Advertiser.] Montreal, March 13.—Every Province in Canada will be represented at the first Canadian and International Good Roads Congress, which will be in Montreal for six days, May 18 to 23. The delegates will discuss the 1914 programs which are interesting every part of the Dominion, for bettering these thoroughfares which will involve an expenditure of more than \$60,000,000.

Every Province in the Dominion has given the subject of good roads increasingly earnest consideration during the past few years and almost all appropriations for the expenditure of huge sums during 1914 have been made. Of the \$60,000,000, a total of more than \$33,-000,000 is available for expenditures 0 from appropriations made by the Legislatures of the various Provinces. cial figures for one or two Provinces have not been obtained, but statistics available today show the various Provinces of the Dominion rank as follows: British Columbia\$6,000,000.00 Saskatchewan 1,200,000.00 Manitoba 2,500,000.00 Ontario 8,500,000.00

The present appropriation made in Ontario is just half the specified amount, \$4,500,000, so the figure stated needs explanation. This sum is on hand now, ready for building and maintenance of roads, but the Province is expected to vote a similar sum at the present session of Parliament. The work last year done under provincial supervision, cost more than \$10,000,000.


