



FARMERS ALIVE TO IMPORTANCE OF SCIENTIFIC STUDY

Agricultural Expert Presents Encouraging Report.

SCHOOL FAIRS POPULAR
Over 1,200 Letters Received Asking for Practical Information.

The report of Roscoe Finn, representative of the department of agriculture, was received by the county council at its meeting on Wednesday afternoon. Mr. Finn's report was of a most encouraging nature. He spoke optimistically of the future of agriculture in this district. He gave details of the work of the department in this locality and by hard facts and figures proved that the younger generation of farmers in Middlesex are taking a great interest in the development of scientific farming.

During the past year there have been 2,800 callers at the offices of the department on the Market Square to obtain information which would aid them in working their farms. He had 1,270 letters asking for information. Ten school fairs have been held, in which 74 schools participated, and a total number of 1,525 pupils took part in competitions of growing produce. Throughout the country there have been 4,500 exhibits held and 41 fruit growers' meetings.

At the short course in agriculture, held at Mount Brydges recently, 100 pupils enrolled and the average attendance per day was 60. The domestic science course, held for the girls, was also very successful and was well attended.

TWO MORE CASES.

NO CARS ON SUNDAY UNLESS ST. RY. MEETS DEMANDS OF BOARD

Councillors Think Company Is Trying to Hold Matters Up.
FIGHT OVER POPULATION
Controllers Will Not Stand for Attempt to Cut Down Mileage.

The board of control, at a special meeting yesterday afternoon, decided upon the program of requirements from the London Street Railway and authorized the forwarding of a proposition to the company at once. If it is not accepted there will be no Sunday cars next Sabbath, the controllers announced.

The request contains the following clauses: That Dundas street be double-tracked from Queen's Park to the inter-switching line. That the Hamilton road line be extended from Rectory street to West street. That a double switch be placed at Marmelon and Rectory streets. That the company pave the track allowances on the Hamilton road, Dundas street east, a portion of Rectory street, Beaufield avenue and other streets that may be required.

Fight Over Population.
This is practically the same proposition offered by the company, with one exception—nothing is mentioned as to population. The board points out that the city is entitled to a mile of track for every 2,000 in population. The company wants to limit the population to 49,000 for the Hamilton road extension, about 2,000 feet. This means that the city is getting less than half a mile, when it is entitled to a mile and a half, an impossible proposition.

The opinion of the board was to the effect that the company was endeavoring to hold matters up. The directors were not favorable to the extensive paving program undertaken, and desired to save as much money on construction work as possible.

The controllers acted under the advice of City Solicitor Meredith, who directed the line of action. The demands made were in line with the procedure of bylaw 315, and according to the act governing such matters.

Now Up To Company.
The communication will be sent to Manager C. E. King in time to reach him some time today. It will be up to the company to announce its policy. Sunday cars were not specifically dealt with. Rev. W. C. Riddford, chaplain of the 12nd Battalion, presented a request from the soldiers encamped here that Sunday cars be not cut off. He explained that from the centre of the city and the cars were necessary for their convenience and comfort. He asked the board to grant the request.

However, the controllers did not take any action on this question. It is a part of the bigger problem and the controllers were decisive in their views. That they would not yield to the company in the matter of Sunday cars until the company showed a spirit of reasonableness, until the company met the wishes of the city.

LABOR DAY PARADE WILL BE HELD AS USUAL THIS YEAR

Some Delegates Favored a Picnic to Springbank.

TRADE CONGRESS COMING
Big Annual Gathering To Be Held in London Next Year.

Labor Day will be observed this year as usual by holding a parade in London. This decision was arrived at by the trades and labor council at its meeting last evening, following a lengthy discussion. Some few of the delegates declared that there should not be any demonstration this year, owing to the war, the delegates feeling that a parade of men not in uniform would not be in keeping with numerous parades of men in khaki, which are seen on the streets.

A proposal was made that the parade be held this year, and that instead, the labor men and their families go to Springbank, hold their games and have a picnic. Both these proposals were rejected by the council, the majority of those present preferring to hold the usual parade.

Was Not Approved.
Delegate Peblar of the cigarmakers wanted to hold the parade on the Saturday preceding Labor Day, each of the locals to send their own parade. The honor roll of the Toronto Photo Engravers' Union was received, and will be placed on the honor roll in the proposed labor parade, which the council hopes to erect shortly.

The council decided to grant \$5 for the aid of the Hatters' Union of England, to hold their annual labor bazaar. Delegate ex-Ald. Max Lerner donated \$25 to the temple fund and \$5 to the election fund.

Delegates Cummings, who attended the trades congress held in Berlin on May 24, representing the local council, reported on the work done by the congress. The congress was held in London, on invitation of Mayor H. A. Stevenson, who attended the congress in Berlin.

The meeting was not well attended. The chair was occupied by Vice-President Donald Wright.
