LOCAL TEMPERATURES.

By comparison with cities in the United States and the average in Canada, London's water rate is low. This morning E. V. Buchanan of the utilities commission stated that according to figures compiled and published in an American municipal magazine, the average in metered cities for the whole of the United Sates was 30 cents per 1,000 gallons, commercial. In Canada, the rate is 10.6 cents per 1,000, while in London the average for both domestic and commercial charges is 10 cents per 1,000 gallons.

The rates in Canada are all the more remarkable when compared with those on the other side when it is remembered that the American gallon is but four-fifths of the imperial gallon, so that for every 1,000 gallons the American rate is based on, the Canadian rate is equivalent to paying for 1,250 American gallons. 24 hours previous to 8 o'clock night were: Highest, 25; lowest, The official temperatures for 12 hours previous to 8 a.m. today were: Highest, 17; lowest, 13.
