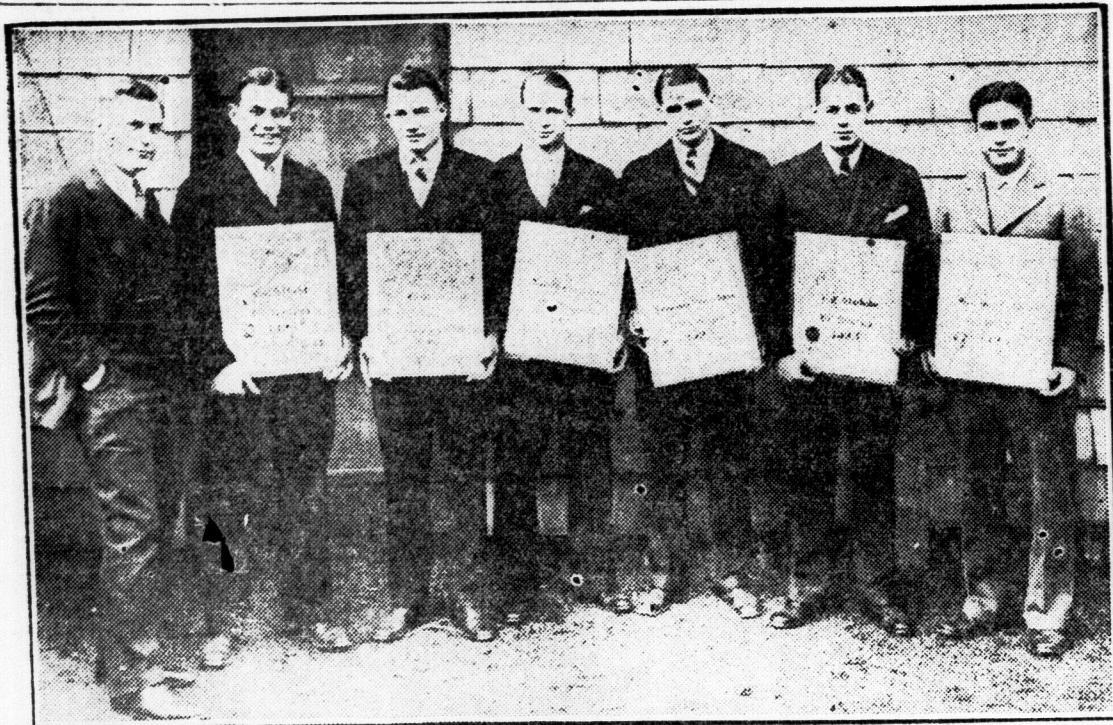


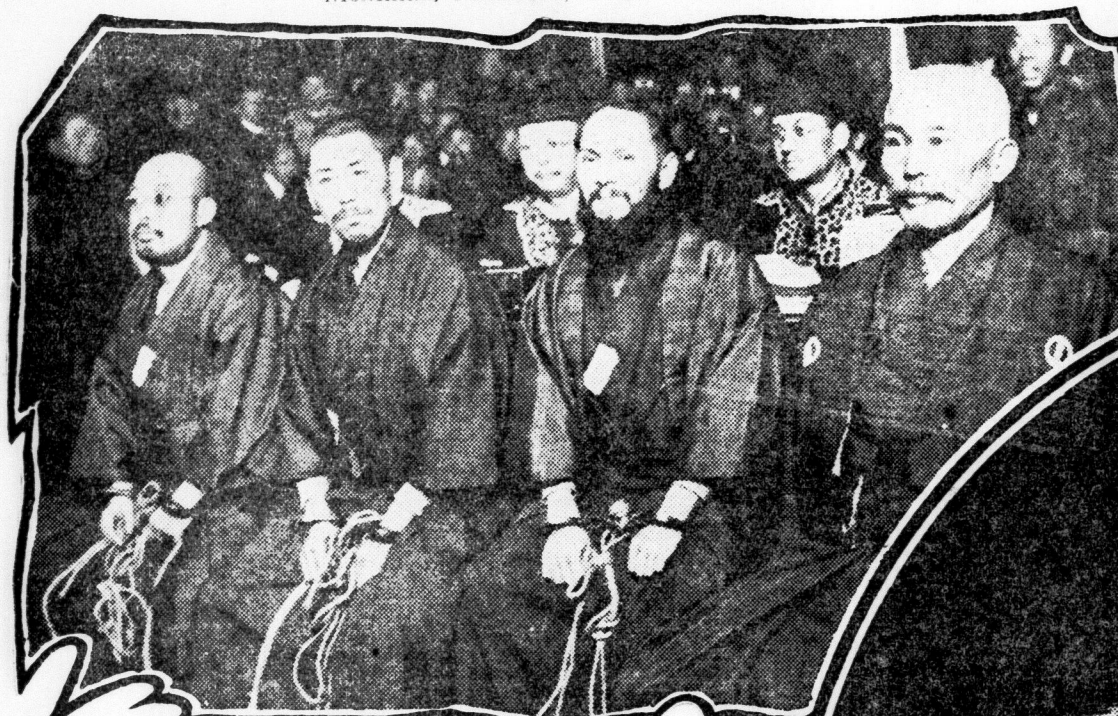
Raging Elements Brood Over Atlantic :: Yesteryear On the Ottawa River

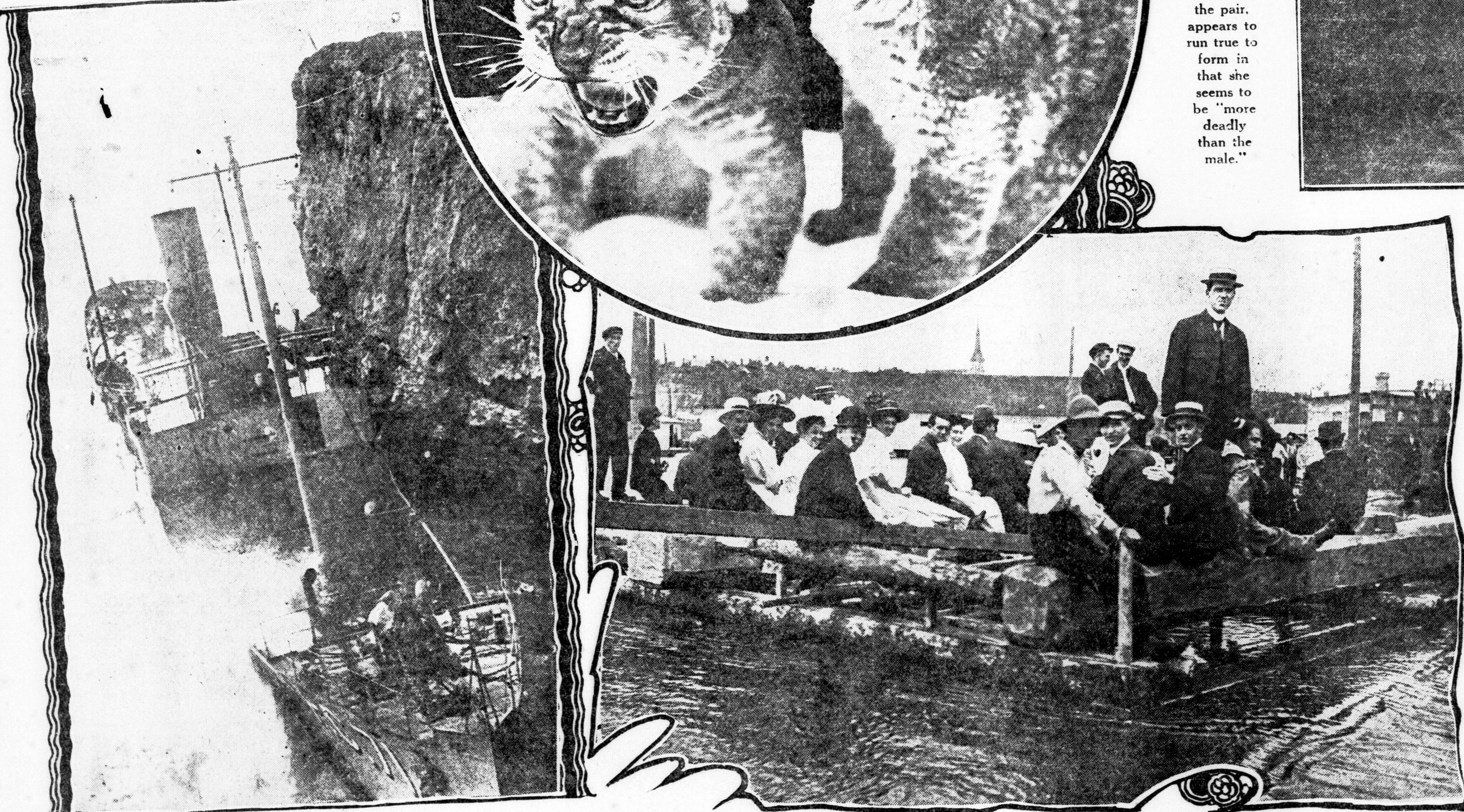
