International relations are not easily strained at the present day when war means so much in the way of expenditure. Undoubtedly, however, alarmists Undoubtedly, however, alarmists will still continue to tell us that war between the aggressive empire of the Mikado and the United States is in-evitable and that when it does come the Pacific coast states will be scourged by the Japanese fleet. 

Each plot is to be two rods long by one rod wide except No. 28, which is to be one rod square. Any person in Ontario may choose






