BURSARIES.

BURSARIES will be awarded during the ensuing session (1857-8) according to the following scheme:—

I. The John Knox Bursary of £10, for the best Synoptical view of Edward's Treatise on the Will, more especially the third and fourth parts, the former parts not to be omitted but treated more succinctly.

II. The George Buchanan Bursary of £10, (founded by Isaac Buchanan, Esq., for eminence in Latin and Greek, as proved by examination in the Grammars of both languages, Livy, Book 1st, 30 chapters; Horace, 3rd Book of Odes, Xenophon's Memorabilia, Book 1st.; Collectanea Majora, Book 1st, chap. 2, 3, 4; Herodotus, Pistratus, and Cyrus, in Col. Maj. Iliad, Book 3rd, 260 lines; Roman Antiquities; and an Exercise in Arnold's Latin Competition.

III. The Gaelic Bursary of £10, for the best Essay on the "Aversion of Men to the Gospel, and the causes to which it may be traced."

The Essays to be given in to the Secretary

of the Professor's Court on or before the 1st of December.

The Essays must be correctly and legibly written, with margins on the title pages, instead of the names of the auditors.

The day of examination to be specified at the opening of the College.

A Student who may have obtained any of the above Bursaries, in any former Session, cannot obtain the corresponding Bursary a second time; though he may compete for it, and if deserving of it, his merit will be noticed.
