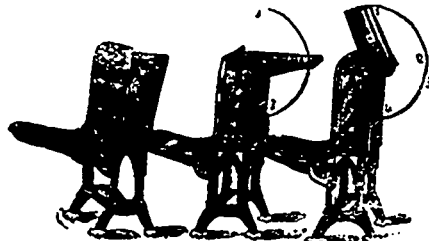

The following is from the V. P. Journal for April:

"A Canadian edition of Ayres' Verbalist has been issued by the Canada Publishing Co., and is being introduced into some of the High Schools. Since the woman loses her name she is properly married to the man. 'Miss B. was married to Mr. A.' Got married is a vulgarity. Will you have another piece of beef, etc. (not meat)? Perpetually means without end, continually means constantly renewed. We sit down, sit a horse, sit for a portrait, set down figures, set a hen. We set a hen, and a hen sits on eggs. We are sometimes as cross as a sitting (not setting) hen. A man writes under, not over, a signature. Personal property is personalty, not personality. Whence (not from whence) do you come? One who talks much of himself is an egotist; one who professes to be sure of nothing but his own existence is an egoist."
