The excellent trade which has prevailed for the last week at the Toronto Cattle Market was even better today. The price of export cattle was very strong and reached the highest ever recorded on this market.

Sheep—Receipts, 12,000; steady; choice lambs higher; good to choice heavy, \$1.75 to \$2.00; choice mixed, \$1.50 to \$1.75; western sheep, \$1.25 to \$1.50; native lambs, \$3.50 to \$4.00; spring lambs, \$7.00.

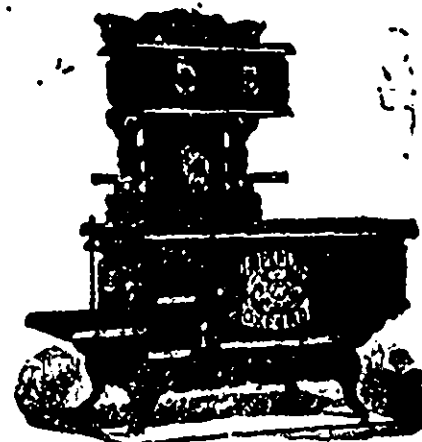
