

Jack Hamilton WARREN

Mr. Warren was born in Kent County, Ontario, in 1921. He received a B.A. from Queen's University in 1941, and served with the Royal Canadian Navy Volunteer Reserve from 1941 to 1945. He has been awarded an honorary degree by Queen's University (1974).

Mr. Warren joined the Department of External Affairs in 1945. In 1954, he transferred to the Department of Finance, served at the Canadian Embassy in Washington as Counsellor (Finance), and was appointed Alternate Executive Director for Canada to the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development and the International Monetary Fund. Rejoining the Department of External Affairs in 1957, he was appointed Counsellor (Economic) in Paris (NATO and OEEC). In 1958, he was appointed Assistant Deputy Minister, Department of Trade and Commerce; in 1964, Deputy Minister, Department of Trade and Commerce; and in 1969 Deputy Minister, Department of Industry, Trade and Commerce. He served as Chairman, Council of Representatives, GATT, in 1960; Deputy Chairman, Canadian Delegation to GATT Tariff Conference, Geneva, 1960-61; and Chairman, Contracting Parties of GATT, 1962-65. In 1971, he was appointed High Commissioner to Great Britain.

Mr. Warren is married to the former Hilary Joan Titterington and has four children.
