

8. Page 36, line 22. Strike out line 22 and substitute therefor:—"to be made one or more copies thereof and shall, upon request by the person from whom the original document was seized or by whom it was produced, in any case where a copy thereof has been made pursuant to this section, send a copy thereof to such person or, if no copy thereof has been made pursuant to this section, allow such person at any reasonable time to have access to the document so seized or produced, and a document".

3. Was a contract awarded? If so, to whom, and what are the terms and conditions?

4. Were any employees of the department dismissed as a result of this action? If so, how many?

5. Were these facilities being used by civilian aviation companies or the Royal Canadian Air Force?

6. What provisions have been made to service civilian aircraft at the Mont-Joli airport?

By Mr. Courtemanche,—Return to an Order of the House, dated August 27, 1958, (*Question No. 184*) showing: 1. Have any contracts been let by any department of the Federal Government for the purchase of buses or other equipment from Western Flyer Coach Limited, Winnipeg, at any time since January 1, 1956?

2. If so, how many buses, or other items of equipment were ordered, what were the specified delivery dates, and what is the unit price of such buses or other items?

By Mr. Courtemanche,—Supplementary Return to an Order of the House, dated July 2, 1958, (**Notice of Motion No. 21*) showing the total amount of election expenses on behalf of each candidate, by constituencies, in the general election of March 31, 1958, as indicated in the return respecting election expenses submitted by the official agent of each candidate, as required under the provisions of Section 63 of the Canada Elections Act; and showing also the names of any candidates, by constituencies, on whose behalf election expense returns have not been submitted.
