PRAYERS.

Mr. Pelletier, a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, laid before the House,—Copies of a statement concerning the federal government's policy with respect to Volume II of the Royal Commission on Bilingualism and Biculturalism. (English and French).—Sessional Paper No. 4/101.

By unanimous consent, it was ordered,—That the said statement be published as an appendix to this day's *Hansard*.

Mr. Francis, seconded by Mr. Honey, by leave of the House, introduced Bill C-145, An Act to amend the Public Service Staff Relations Act, which was read the first time and ordered to be printed and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.

The House resumed debate on the motion of Mr. Pepin, seconded by Mr. Davis,—That Bill C-6, An Act to wind up the Canadian Corporation for the 1967 World Exhibition and to authorize the writing-off of certain costs and the deferral of certain payments connected therewith, be now read a second time and referred to the Standing Committee on Finance, Trade and Economic Affairs.

After further debate, the question being put on the said motion, it was agreed to.

Accordingly, the said bill was read the second time and referred to the Standing Committee on Finance, Trade and Economic Affairs.
