Therefore, I would hold that the notion of a new description of what is the subject-matter of a bill and the notion of an independent commission, which would be the subject, I would think, of discussion and perhaps disagreement as to composition, both introduce, in my opinion, a new concept to the Bill which did not previously exist.

I will not go on to deal with the other very interesting point raised by the Parliamentary Secretary to the President of the Privy Council (Mr. Reid), namely that the establishment of an independent commission might indeed call for additional financing—and I can hardly think of anyone who would be more sensitive to that problem than the honourable Member for Winnipeg North Centre, who I am sure would conclude, on the basis of that very possibility, that the recommendation contained in the Bill would have to be altered for that very purpose alone.

For at least three reasons therefore, I have to hold that the amendment that has been put forward introduces on at least three grounds a totally new proposition, and offends all the precedents.
