which saw that the work was carried out according to specifications. Is it the intention of the corporation to establish a supervisory staff to supervise work let out by tender in order to see that it is carried out according to specifications, or will they turn that supervisory work over to the Department of Public Works?

Mr. MacKINNON: That question could better be asked while the officials are before me, but I would think the Canadian Commercial Corporation would have the benefit of the necessary supervisory staff from the Department of National Defence. I believe the corporation could either let a contract through or arrange with the Department of Public Works to do certain projects, or let it to a private company or corporation.
