Mr. MacKINNON: That question could better be asked while the officials are before me, but I would think the Canadian Commercial Corporation would have the benefit of the necessary supervisory staff from the Department of National Defence. I believe the corporation could either let a contract through or arrange with the Department of Public Works to do certain projects, or let it to a private company or corporation.

On section 1—Corporation empowered to exercise powers of the minister in respect to national defence department requisitions.

Mr. DIEFENBAKER: I again raise for the minister's attention the question as to whether or not it is not necessary that section 4 be amended in order to permit of the powers being tacked on that are provided for in the new section 17. I do not desire to repeat the argument that I advanced before, but I do want the minister to give consideration to the lack of powers contained in section 4, in which are set out the purposes of the Canadian Commercial Corporation. At the expense of reiteration I point out this, and I am just reading the pertinent portions:

The corporation is established for the following purposes:

(a) to assist in the development of trade between Canada and other nations—
