Your personal letter to the Principal arrived after his departure for England so that I will put it away privately until his return. As a fellow Haligonian and one who lived through the whole period when Professor Stanley was Assistant to the Frincipal (a period of nine months only, during the most of which time Sir Arthur was away in India and had left every dean in charge of his own faculty and the administration thus completely decentralized) there is a volume I could write, but I think I had better keep out of the present controversy. He was never at any time Assistant Principal, or actually in charge. Dr. James wrate a letter to the editor of Saturday Night before he left but I doubt if it will be published.
