lished till the year 1834, though it was the first book of the kind that had ever been published respecting the Falls. Most of the first edition was sold in the course of three months last season. From an intercourse with a vast number of visiters at all seasons of the year, he has been enabled to ascertain what *kind* of information they most need, and has greatly enlarged the present edition in order, if possible, to afford ample information in relation to every thing connected with the Falls and vicinity, about which inquiries would naturally be made.

New editions of this Manual will be published from time to time, as they may be needed, containing notices of incidents and such additional information as may be useful to the Traveler and Tourist.
