SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS. The sole head of a family, or any mal

over eighteen years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency) on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and

cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least eighty acres, on certain con-ditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.
In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price

section alongside his homestead. Price, \$3.00 per acre,

Dutles—Six months' residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also fifty acres extra cultivation. Fre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain

A settler who has exhausted his home stead right may take a purchased home-stead in certain districts. Price, \$3.90 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of the three years, cultivate fifty acres, and erect a house worth \$300. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby of stony land. Live stock may be substi-tuted for cultivation under certain con-
