

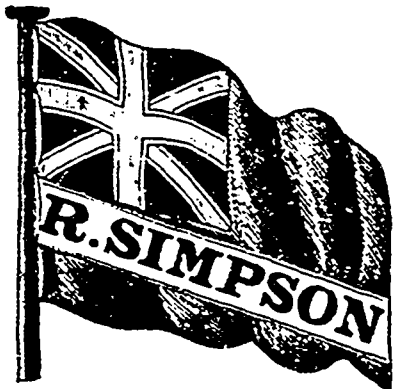
Hamilton.

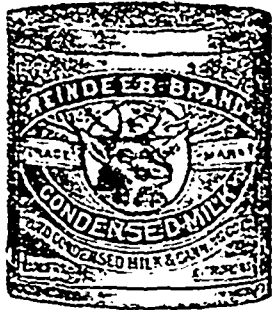
