Secondly, we would plainly say that we emphatically protest against your personal allusions to Dr. Harris, and especially Dr. Stewart, in that and other issues. Your reflections are purely personal and are not shared by the denomination though they may appear officially in our paper. To say the very least, they are uncalled for, and are beneath the dignity of *The Canadian Baptist*.

Now in closing, let us say as to the main issue, that truth will triumph, and facts will come out, but we want them to come through their natural channels, and not to be forced to come to us through pamphlets, or the secular press, or any round about way. We are certain that if you contribute to this end in your official capacity, you will secure the love of the churchat large, and of every member of it in particular.
