## Wood Claims in Carscallen For \$250,000.

PORCUPINE, Aug. 6.—(Special.)— Big mining interests are entering Cripple Creek, and yesterday A. D. Miles, consulting engineer for the Dome mines, took an option on the seven Jowsey-Wood syndicate claims on the middle line of Carscallen Town-ship, for \$260,000. Fifteen men have been sent to sink two shafts. Well-Known Veterinary Surgeon Vic-tim of Nervous Breakdown.


One of the best known veterinary


