ALBANIAN DRIVE TO CAUSE REVOLT

Allied Successes Already Stir Up Slavs Against Masters. UNREST ON INCREASE. Total Population of Nineteen Million May Spring to Arms.

Washington, July 16.—While military circles both here and abroad regard the Franco-Italian offensive along the coast of Albania as of little moment from a purely military viewpoint, some officials regard it as having possibilities from a political standpoint which ultimately may bear heavily on the military situation.

Reports reaching Washington from official circles indicate that the successes attained by the allied troops already have increased the hostility of the Jugo-Slavs in southern Austria...

On the outbreak of war the Jugo-Slavs in southern Austria and Hungary numbered more than 6,000,000 while the Czech-Slovaks and Poles in the northern part of the dual monarchy numbered more than 13,000,000.
