

The doing of evil is no part of the detective's work." "To the public the task of the criminal police consists solely in tracking and selzing the author of the crime. The position pre-sents itself in this way: A robbery has been committed; some one did it; he is somewhere, and all the police have to do is to find him. But here is just where the difficulty lies. It is not so much to find the man, as to know that he is the man, to fix the guilt on him, to identify him with the robber.
