PARALLELISM WANNING.

THE BUTT

Laborites Have Gained Much in Dublin Elections.

WOMEN ALLOWED TO VOTE

The First Time That They Have Had a Chance to Ballot.

Representation of Labor Has Been Quadrupled and Parnellists Have Only Half Their Former Strength

—John Redmond and Timothy Harrington Both Bitten by Labor Men—Parnellite Majority in Cork Reduced to One-Increase of Nationalist Power.

Dublin, Jan. 17.—Elections to the Town Council were held yesterday throughout Ireland. These are the first elections under the new law. Only a few minor disturbances are reported. There are indications of large Home Rule and Nationalist majorities.

Judging from the results known at mid-night, the elections have been remarkable for the success of the Laborites and the waning power of Parnellism. The new feature is that women were allowed to vote for the first time.

In Dublin the representation of labor has been quadrupled, while the Parnellites have secured little more than half their former strength, although, owing to internal dissensions in Mr. John Redmond's party, it is rather difficult to give an accurate estimate. Mr. Redmond himself has been elected for one ward, but he did not head the poll, and, therefore, misses the aldermanship. Mr. Timothy Harrington (member of Parliament for the Harbor Division of Dublin) is in the same boat, having been topped by a new Laborite.

In Cork the Parnellites have done better, but they have failed to retain their former ascendancy, having now only a majority of one over the Dilworths, while the Laborites have secured nine seats. Wherever, however, the issue was between a Parnellite and anti-Parnellite, and the question was squarely fought, without internal squabbles, the Parnellites were victorious. Speaking generally, there is an increase of Nationalist power, but nothing like a rigorous exclusion of Unionists.

DAIRMEN MET IN GUELPH.

Between 400 and 500 Butter and Cheese Producers Gathered in the Royal City.

Guelph, Jan. 17.—The annual convention of the Cheese and Butter Makers' Association of Western Ontario opened here this afternoon in the Royal Opera House, and will be in convention for the balance of the week. From four to five hundred delegates and officers are present. President of the Association is Mr. J. H. Miller, of the city of Guelph. He presented a report, which was adopted.

The financial statement was presented, showing a balance on hand of \$1800.00. The sum of \$22,500 was granted by the Government. The instructions received from the Government were read. Mr. Miller commended the success of the season they had just had, and pointed out the desirability of business. He regretted that Mr. T. B. Miller had resigned as an instructor. They had carried for the season a large number of hogs to something better, and he hoped they would have a large number of good man to accept the position for a year or two.

THE SWAN RIVER VALLEY

Is to Get an Accession of 1500 to Its Population From Northern Ontario.

Montreal, Jan. 17.—(Special.)—It will be a surprise to the people of Ontario to learn that a whole community, with their postmaster, counting 1500 souls, is about to be taken up from the District of Muskoka and transplanted to one of the most fertile districts of Manitoba. This, however, is the fact, and the removal will likely take place in the early spring. Delegates have been sent out to the various towns in the valley, and there selected the future homes of the 1500. The families of the future McKenzie &amp; Mann railway, the Lake Manitoba, Railway and Canal Company, and the Lake Manitoba and Porcupine Mountains, embracing some ten townships in length and five or six in width, and containing in all about three-quarters of a million acres of the finest soil in the Province of Manitoba. Some 4000 new settlers went up here last year, and it is expected that 10,000 new-comers will settle down in the Swan River Valley this year.
