TRENT RIVER BRIDGE DISASTER

Union Colliery Company Found Guilty of Criminal Negligence.

Victoria, B.C., Oct. 7.—After hearing, extending over four days, the charge of criminal negligence brought by the Crown against the Union Colliery Company, in connection with the collapse of the Trent River bridge, was placed in the hands of the jury shortly after noon today. After being out three hours the jury returned with a verdict of guilty. The defendant company gave notice of intention to move in arrest of judgment, and asked permission for a case stated, all points being reserved. His Lordship postponed judgment until the full court has decided on the reserve case.
