Unemployment and whiskey were blamed for the present deorable prevalence of crime in the province, by the grand jury return-ing its presentment at the county ling its presentment at the county court assizes yesterday afternoon. It recommended changes in the Ontario temperance act to bring the sale of liquor entirely under government control and agencies and suggested public works and municipal and provincial undertakings to provide employment.

Juvenile delinquency was also noted and regretted, and more activity on the part of truant officers recommended, along with a stricter censorship of moving pictures and rigid control of children's amusements. Closer home supervision was also favored.

The jury found conditions at the Ontario Hospital for the Insane much improved, better methods in vogue, and the patients improving in temperament because of the greater freedom allowed them. There are 1,300 patients in the hospital.
