There had been ill-feeling between the pair. Both were married and have families.

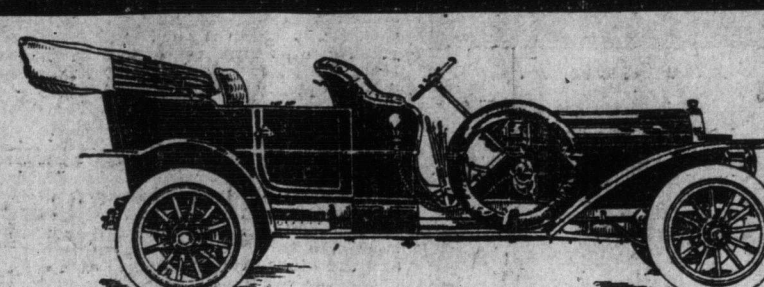
Central Criminal Court.
